Brief research reports — a summary of a nearly or recently completed research project with discussion of preliminary results

Review papers — contemporary review and discussion of findings in areas relevant to research or treatment

Case studies — description of evaluations or treatments involving one or several patients with discussion of outcomes

Consult column — an inquiry about a clinical problem; advice and suggestions will be offered by experienced professionals
