The Australian and New Zealand Association for the Advancement of Science

Thirty-third Annual Meeting of the Society of Rheology

THE Society of Rheology plans to hold its thirty-third Annual Meeting at the Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland, October 29–31. The technical sessions are expected to comprise about thirty papers. Selection is in the hands of the Program Committee: EDWARD A. COLLINS (Chairman), W. H. BAUER, N. NAKAJIMA, D. J. PLAZEK, J. GAVIS, W. L. PETICOLAS, and E. B. BAGLEY.

The feasibility of a symposium on *Molecular and Particulate Rheology* is being assessed by Dr. J. GAVIS (The Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore 18, Maryland). An attempt to organize a symposium on *Polymer Chain Entanglement* is being made by Drs. N. NAKA-JIMA (W. R. Grace and Co., Washington Research Center, Clarksville, Maryland) and W. L. PETICOLAS (IBM Research Laboratory, San Jose 14, California). The possibility of a second symposium on *Blood Rheology* is being actively pursued by Dr. E. A. COLLINS (B. F. Goodrich Chemical Co. P.O. Box 122, Avon Lake, Ohio). The first symposium on *Blood Rheology* was held at Madison, Wisconsin, October 30–November 1, 1961, and will be publisned shortly in Vol. VI of the Transactions of the Society of Rheology.

Those wishing to participate at this annual meeting should notify Dr. EDWARD A. COLLINS, Chairman of the Program Committee or a committee member as soon as possible and a title should be submitted. Two copies of abstracts should be in the hands of the Program Committee by August 15 to permit the committee to establish the final program and to allow publication of the abstracts in the fall issue of the Society of Rheology Bulletin.
