In 1959 Professor A.L. Copley and I were commissioned personally by Mr. Robert Maxwell to start a Journal to be called BIORHEOLOGY with the two of us as Co-Editors-In-Chief.

The first number appeared in 1962 and, from then on till a year ago, we two were responsible for every paper that was submitted to the Journal, finding suitable referees and taking the final decision as to publication.

With the new arrangements which started about a year ago, we now have twelve Editors and this leaves Professor Copley and myself less to do.

Nevertheless, I am now 76 years old and my sight is failing, I cannot see to read scientific papers nor to use the Science Library. In spite of much help from my wife and other kind friends, I feel that I am no longer keeping abreast of the recent work on biorheology published in our Journal and in many others.

I do not feel competent to continue as Editor-in-Chief and have told the Managing Director of Pergamon and Professor Copley that I intend to resign as from December 31st of the current year.
