27 JULY to 1 AUGUST, 1969

The next International Conference on Hemorheology will take place at Heidelberg from Sunday July 27 to Friday August 1, 1969, under the auspices of the University of Heidelberg. The Honorary Conference Chairman is Professor G. Quadbeck, Director, Institute for Pathochemistry and General Neurochemistry, Department of Pathology, University of Heidelberg. #### FREE COMMUNICATIONS

Members wishing to present free communications of 15 minutes (including discussion) should send a title and a 300 word abstract to Professor Hartert as soon as possible.

A person wishing to present a communication must either be a member of the Society or have applied for membership, and should state his membership status on the abstract.

#### POISEUILLE GOLD MEDAL AWARD

The Council of the Society, which is comprised of the six officers and eleven Scientific Committee Chairmen, elected Dr. G. W. Scott Blair as recipient for the 1969 Poiseuille Gold Medal Award. The award is sponsored by Pharmacia, as was the first Award, of Uppsala, Sweden; it was instituted at the First International Conference on Hemorheology at the University of Iceland and first awarded to the late Professor Robin Fåhraeus.
