

## Erratum




Fig. 1. The diagram on the left shows a linearly increasing global emissions business-as-usual scenario (grey curve) and a scenario that stabilizes global emissions at current levels (colored curve). Under the latter scenario, the CO<sub>2</sub> concentration in the atmosphere would continue to grow (middle diagram). So would the global temperature (diagram on right). (Source: see footnote 5 in article.)

The Editor regrets a printing error discovered following publication of the article by O.J. Røgeberg, S. Andresen, and B. Holtsmark, *International Climate Treaties: The Case for Pessimism*, 1 Climate Law 177–197 (2010). The leftmost diagram in Figure 1 on page 181, showing global CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, is incorrect. The correct version is shown below.
