London, August 15th-21th 1990

The 2nd Computer Olympiad will take place at Queen Mary & Westfield College, London University, from August 15th-21th 1990. This is a change of venue from last year. Queen Mary & Westfield College is in Mile End Road, London E1, and is only 5 minutes walk from Mile End or Stepney Green underground stations.

The Computer Olympiad is a kind of Olympic Games for computers and computer programs. The programs will be playing against each other at a variety of well-known strategy games:

The rules for the various tournaments are almost exactly the same as last year. The most important differences are: (a) In Chinese Chess we will playing Chinese rules, so a threefold repetition counts as a loss: (b) In 9×9 Go the komi will be 6 and in 19×19 Go the komi will be 8.

The 2nd London Conference on Computer Games will take place alongside the Olympiad. Papers are invited on any aspect of programming "thinking" games. Papers should ideally be 3,000 to 4,000 words in length, though papers of any length will be considered. The Chairman of the conference will once again be Professor Tony Marsland, from the Computing Science Department, University of Alberta, Edmonton, Canada.
