Further, the topic of data base producer/system supplier relationships is now being studied by the Information Industry Association (IIA) through a new Data Base Producers Committee chaired by Dr. Lois Granick.

I urge the readers of ISU to take advantage of the improved climate that these activities represent by corresponding with the Editors. We will promise that your views are transmitted to the proper channels.
