IATUL Conference 1985

Oxford (Keble College), United Kingdom, will be the site of the Eleventh Conference—under the theme “The future of information resources for science and technology, and the role of libraries”—of the International Association of Technological University Libraries (IATUL), scheduled for 15–19 April 1985.

This event is being organized in association with the Fédération Internationale de Documentation (FID) and the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA) Section of Science and Technology Libraries. There is a limit on the number of participants who can be accepted, and therefore early registration is advised.

The program will cover the following aspects of resource sharing and exchange of information on science and technology, looking to the end of the twentieth century:

- the balance between public- and private-sector resources;
- information access in a centrally planned economy;
- the future of serial publications;
- the future of ‘grey’ literature;
- the impact of unprinted information and of access to electronically stored data;
- local access in a national context;
- the industrial and commercial use of national, regional and university resources.

Each session will be introduced by theme papers from invited speakers.
