This *From the Editor* will focus on the six regular articles and the column from the Canadian Association of Occupational Therapists (CAOT).

This issue begins with a column by our Canadian colleagues on cognitive work hardening with a specific focus on a return-to-work intervention for people with depression.

Glimne and colleagues add to the growing body of evidence on the impact of vision on work with an article on measuring glare induced visual fatigue by fixation disparity variation.

Österholm, Björk and Håkansson investigated factors of importance for maintaining work as perceived by men with arthritis.

Smith addresses an important factor for persons with disabilities: The relationship of employment status and money stress.

Memarpour, Badakhsh and Khosroshahi investigated work-related musculoskeletal disorders among dentists.

White and colleagues authored an important stakeholder-centered best-evidence synthesis of systematic reviews about modifiable workplace risk factors contributing to workplace absence across health conditions.

The regular section of this issue concludes with an article by Albin who shares a method to improve the accuracy of pair-wise combinations of anthropometric elements when only limited data are available.
