Over 500 Libraries to Get Digital Boost in Tamil Nadu Soon

In a first across the country, 152 virtual reality devices worth INR65.54 lakh have been introduced in 76 libraries across Tamil Nadu. This aims to give readers an enhanced reading experience and also attract children into the world of books. The directorate of public libraries additionally plans to provide internet connection at all the libraries, introduce digital library facilities in 500 libraries based on footfall and also start doorstep delivery of books. The directorate is also planning to introduce digital libraries in 500 libraries across the State. At present, only Anna Centenary library has a digital library with more than 3,000 books. However, this is still in the discussion stage and funds will be allocated soon, said the officials.

Rajasthan Approves INR36 Crore to Set Up Digital Libraries in Schools

The Government of Rajasthan has sanctioned INR36.56 crore to set up digital libraries in 344 residential schools across the state, as per an official statement. Furthermore, Chief Minister Mr Ashok Gehlot approved the amount in compliance with the announcement made during the discussion of the Finance and Appropriation Bill 2022/23, the statement added. The statement further added that in view of the importance of digital learning in today's scenario, Gehlot had announced the financial provision for digital libraries and other necessary facilities for classes 9 to 12 in residential educational institutes and selected schools under various departments.

The facility will also be used for preparing students for competitive exams like JEE, NEET, and CUET. To access the platform, students will be provided an ID and password using which they can login and attend classes. The platform will also provide facilities like digital library, recorded lectures, etc.

Mumbai: Tata Hospital to Set Up National Digital Library

The Koita Foundation will help further digitalize medical records by introducing artificial intelligence, which will provide better treatment accessibility to patients. This will help to create a data bank of the patients suffering from different types of cancer across India which will help in research and policy-making.

National Virtual Library of India Has a Total of About 3.04 Lakh Digital Artefacts, Informs Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy

"The National Virtual Library of India has a total of about 3.04 lakh digital artefacts and more than 34.91 lakh bibliographic entries." This information was provided by Union Minister of Culture, Mr G. Kishan Reddy in the Rajya Sabha on 4 August 2022. The Union Minister further informed that the Ministry ensures that all its organizations hand over both bibliographical and digital resources to the National Virtual Library of India for integration on the Indian Culture Portal regularly. The portal, <https:// indianculture.gov.in> is available in the public domain. The content on the portal is presented in 18 curated categories, namely, Rare Books, E-books, Archives, Gazettes and Gazetteers, Manuscripts, Museum Collections, Paintings, Audios, Intangible Cultural Heritage, Photo Archives, Images, Videos, Content from UNESCO, Research Papers, Indian National Bibliography, Reports and Proceedings, Union Catalogues, and other Catalogues.

Flying colours: a digital feather library for Indian birds is taking off

A digital feather library has just been fluffed out. It contains high-resolution images of wings and feathers from at least 50 species, with more being added. Alongside each colourful spread, viewers can find details of the bird's weight, body length, beak width, etc, along with the date, location and cause of death. A first-of-its-kind repository for Indian birds, the aim is to aid avian research and help in the niche field of feather transplants. The resource is accessible to the public free, and aims to also help birders identify species they've spotted. <Featherlibrary.com> was launched on 15 November 2021 and will act as a reference point for feather transplants. Based on availability, actual feathers can also be drawn from the library.
